Parks & Recreation Winter Happenings

Once again, the Parks & Recreation Department would like to thank the "Big Chill Crew" and the Riverside Junior Woman's Charity for their support. Without the financial assistance and volunteer efforts of these two groups, the ice rink in Big Ball Park would not be possible. Weather permitting, the hours for skating will be from 8:00 a.m.—9:00 p.m. Please be courteous of other skaters and residents who live near the park. The color coded flag system will be used again this year to signify ice conditions. A red flag means the surface is not suitable for skating and the rink is closed. The green flag means that skaters are welcome!



Winter sledding at the Swan Pond continues to be a favorite activity of many Riverside residents. The Parks and Recreation Department asks that everyone observe the following general rules when sledding.

- Never walk up the middle of the hill. Use the sides!
- Maintain control of your sled or tube at all times.
- Be alert for others around you, especially younger children.
- Report any unsafe conditions to the Parks & Recreation Department by calling 442-7025. If you are calling during non-business hours, please call the Riverside Police Department non-emergency number at 447-2127.
- Please sled in designated areas only.

Snow Removal

During the snow and ice season, it is the goal of the Public Works Department to maintain Village roadways at bare pavement condition curb-to-curb in order to ensure delivery of emergency services and provide access to the motoring public. The department will begin plowing all major arterial streets when salt is no longer providing effective melting and snow has accumulated to a depth of 1 inch. Arterials (main roads that run through the village), the Central Business District, village parking lots, train station platforms and streets near schools will be cleared first. Secondary streets and all other parking lots will be cleared next. Cul-desacs, alleys, dead-ends and sidewalks in the CBD will be cleared after that. Holiday Safety Tips

The holiday season is always a special time of year. It is also a time when busy people can become vulnerable to theft and other crime. The Riverside Police Department wishes everyone a safe, happy and peaceful holiday season. To that end, please follow these common sense holiday safety guidelines and share them with friends and family.

When Driving—Avoid driving alone at night. If you need to shop at night, be sure to park in a well lighted area, as close to your destination as possible. Take note of where you park so you will be able to easily locate your vehicle after shopping. Do not leave packages or other valuables in plain sight in your vehicle. Lock packages in the trunk or place them under a seat. Locate your keys before leaving the store instead of searching for them in the parking lot. Do not approach your car alone if there are suspicious people in the area. Ask mall or store security to escort you to your vehicle.

When Using an ATM—Choose an ATM located inside a mall or in a well lighted area. Make sure that no one can see you entering your PIN and don't discard your receipt at the ATM. Take it with

When Shopping—Shop during daylight hours whenever possible. Dress casually and avoid wearing expensive jewelry. Do not carry a purse or wallet if possible. Instead, carry necessary cash, checks and/or credit cars in a front pocket. Avoid overloading yourself with purchases and beware of strangers approaching you for any reason.

When out with Children—Make sure children know their full name, address and phone number. Children should stay close to parents at all times. Teach your child to ask for help from a store clerk if you become separated while shopping. Children should never be allowed to make unaccompanied trips to public bathrooms and should never be left unattended in a vehicle.

When Away from Home-Put indoor and outdoor lights on timers and leave a radio or television on so the premises look and sound occupied. Do not leave holiday gifts or other expensive belongings near windows or doors where they are easily visible from outside. Always lock doors and keep windows closed and locked. If you're leaving for an extended trip, have a trusted friend or family member watch your house and pick up mail and newspapers while you're away.

When at Home—Be aware that criminals sometimes pose as couriers delivering packages. It is also not uncommon for criminals to take advantage of the generosity of people during the holiday season by soliciting donations door-to-door for charitable causes although no charity is involved. Always ask for identification and only donate to recognized charitable organizations.

Water Rate Increase

As most residents will recall, the City of Chicago increased the water rate charged to suburban municipalities by 25% in 2012. This rate increase resulted in higher water bills for Riverside residents. At that time, Chicago also announced plans to further



increase water rates by 15% annually in 2013, 2014 and 2015. These increases will apply to each of the 130 suburbs that purchase water directly from Chicago or through intermediaries, so residents should expect to see an increase in the water rate on the accompanying bill. Some ways to offset this increase are:

1) Only run the dishwasher and washing machine with a full load. 2) Don't leave water running when washing dishes by hand or cleaning food. Instead,

wash dishes or vegetables in a stoppered sink or pan of clean water. 3) Keep a pitcher of drinking water in the refrigerator instead of letting water run to cool off. And 4) Check faucets and pipes for leaks frequently.

Winter Fire Safety Tips

Home electrical fires claim the lives of 280 Americans annually and most winter fires are electrical. The following electrical fire safety tips are intended to help residents maintain a fire-safe

- Frayed wires can cause fires. Replace or repair worn or damaged appliance cords immediately.
- Replace or repair any electrical tool that overheats, shorts out, gives off smoke or sparks or causes small electrical shocks.
- When shopping for electrical appliances, look for the UL label. These products have been safety tested by a nationally recognized laboratory.
- Always keep electrical appliance away from wet floors and countertops.
- Keep clothing, curtains and other combustibles at least three feet away from all heat sources.
- Never overload extension cords or wall sockets.
- Immediately shut off any light switches that are hot to the touch and have a licensed electrician replace them.
