New Village Board Sworn In



On May 6, Benjamin Sells was sworn in as Village President of Riverside along with newly elected Trustees Patricia Collins and Douglas Pollock. Newly appointed Trustee Michael Foley was also sworn in. Newly elected Trustee Ellen Hamilton was unable to attend the meeting and will be sworn in at a later day. These individuals join current village board members Joseph Ballerine and Jean Sussman as your Village Board of Trustees. Comprehensive Sewer Study

At their April 15 Regular Meeting, the Village Board of Trustees approved an agreement with Christopher B. Burke Engineering, Ltd. to conduct a comprehensive review of the entire village sewer system. The purpose of the study is to identify deficiencies and establish a project priority list. The evaluation of the sewer system will confirm the existing capacities of sewers and identify system deficiencies likely to contribute to surcharging and associated problems. The report will be used to prioritize repair projects in association with sewer utility financial planning. The engineering firm expects to complete the project and present their findings to the Village Board by October.

Time to Renew Vehicle Stickers & Dog Licenses

Renewal forms were mailed to residents on May 13. Stickers must be purchased and displayed no later than June 30 to avoid penalties. Current stickers are required for all vehicles housed in Riverside or registered (with the Secretary of State) to a Riverside address. Renewals with no changes can be renewed on-line until June 30. Stickers can also be renewed by mail or by leaving the completed form along with payment in the silver lock box in front of the village office. Staff will process your paperwork and mail your sticker to you. Please consider using these convenient renewal options rather than standing in line at the Village office.

If your vehicle is no longer registered or housed in Riverside, you must provide the village with a copy of the bill of sale or other disposal record such as an insurance report or Secretary of State registration showing that the vehicle is no longer registered in Riverside. If a vehicle remains registered in Riverside but is used or stored out of town (such as with a college student or at second home), a sticker is still required. Dog owners must provide proof of current rabies inoculation. All dogs must be licensed.

Bicycle Safety



Picture this, you're leaving a local restaurant in the Central Business District after a delicious meal. As you leave the establishment, you glance to your left and realize that you're on a collision course with a young bicyclist who's speeding toward you down the sidewalk. You jump backwards and manage to avoid being hit by the bicycle rider, but both of you are shocked and frightened by the experience. Unfortunately, this scenario plays out on a regular basis because many people are unaware that it is unlawful to ride a bicycle or skateboard on the public sidewalk in the Central Business District. Bicyclists are required to share the street with motorists in the Central Business District or walk their bicycles on the sidewalk. Whether you're walking, riding a bike or driving a vehicle, please be considerate of those around you. With the onset of warmer weather, there will be more pedestrians and bicyclists in the village and we all need to share the road. Some things to remember when riding a bike:

- Bicyclists must stop at stop signs.
- When riding at night, a bicycle light is required.
- Helmets are the best protection from head injuries when riding a bike. Always wear your helmet and make sure your children wear helmets too.

Property Transfer Requirements

Riverside Village Code Section 4-1-6(B) requires that property owners obtain a Certificate of Compliance whenever title is transferred for a structure, building or dwelling unit, whether or not there is monetary consideration. The expense is the seller's responsibility, and the Certificate of Compliance must be given to the new owner at the time of closing.



An inspection of the property is required for interior and exterior. A stamped copy of the Plat of Survey is required which is no older than six months. The survey must be submitted no later than one week before closing.

What does the inspector look for?

The Compliance Officer checks to see if there is anything about the property that might not meet with the current zoning ordinances. (This is not a homeowner's inspection which checks for problems with the building, such as roof leaks, electrical or furnace problems.)

What if something on the property doesn't comply?

Anything about the property that doesn't comply with current zoning ordinances will be noted on the Certificate of Compliance. More than likely no corrective action will be required before the property is sold, but this is a way to inform the new owner of any items that are non-conforming to the zoning code. If the new owner wants to make alterations in the future, the items will have to be brought into compliance with our current ordinances.

For example, currently a driveway for a detached garage can be no wider than 10 feet. If the existing driveway is wider than 10 feet, it would be noted on the Certificate of Compliance. Then if the new owner wanted to replace the driveway, it would have to be reduced in size to the required 10 foot width.

What happens during the inspection?

The Compliance Officer checks the property for setbacks, width of driveways, and any accessory structures (sheds, garages, etc.) He walks through the inside of the property to verify that it complies with zoning uses, such as single family home, multi-family building, commercial, etc. At the same time, the final water meter reading is taken.

When does the inspection take place?

The Compliance inspection will be scheduled for approximately one week before closing, but you should call to make the appointment as soon as you have a closing date. We need the name of the current owner, the name of the buyer, and a contact person who we will call if we have questions and to notify when the Certificate of Compliance is ready to be picked up. You need to call the Building Department at (708) 447-1241 to set up the inspection date. You will be given an exact day and time for this inspection.

How much does this cost?

The cost depends on the type of property in question. The cost for a single family dwelling is \$175.00 plus the final water bill. Also added to the cost are any fees owed to the Village of Riverside, such as parking tickets or municipal fines. If you have any outstanding building permits, final inspections should also be arranged.
